

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF
WELLS RURAL ELECTRIC COMPANY

August 20, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 10:05 a.m. on August 20, 1976, in the board room of Wells Rural Electric Company, Wells, Nevada. President James Ballard presiding.

Those present were: Jim Ballard, Eugene Pengelly, John Krenka, Robert Wright, Vernon Dalton, William Gibbs, Arthur Grock, and Clarence Swett. Ray Crawford came in late. Thomas Achurra and Glenn Wadsworth were unable to attend. Present from the staff were: Don Snyder, Manager; Pat Nolz, Richard Loveland, Joe Ward, Ellie Rutherford, Bud Calton, Bobbi Samuels, and Robert Vaughan, Attorney. Guests present were Jack Stevens from R.E.A. in Washington; Clarence Lee of Lee Engineering; and Mike Jensen, Chairman of the Nominating Committee.

There was one correction to the minutes. Vernon Dalton made the motion concerning the Wendover pump bill and Ray Crawford seconded the motion. The minutes were approved as corrected.

There were three additions to the agenda. Analysis of the By-Laws by Robert Vaughan, Tent Mountain by Arthur Grock, and selection of Election Committee by Jim Ballard.

Construction: Joe Ward reported that we are installing a circular sprinkler for Paul Smith of Ruby Valley. 1400 feet of underground work will be needed for this job. The Financial and Statistical Report was handed out to the board members. Don Snyder pointed out that the cost of maintenance is down because there hasn't been as much work on distribution expense. Most of the work has been in new construction, and not as much cost has occurred in power outages this year.

Settlement with Idaho Power: The trial is set for December 1 in Reno before Judge Bruce Thompson in District Court. Robert Vaughan reported that all our witnesses are lined up and ready to go.

Pine Valley/Carlin: The residents will go through the legislature to change their city charter so they can get their power from us.

Raft River Intertie: The Board has been invited to attend a meeting in the Raft River offices in Malta, Idaho this Wednesday to discuss the intertie. Bob Wright, Art Grock, Vernon Dalton, Jim Ballard, Clarence Swett, Glenn Wadsworth, and Ray Crawford will attend this meeting in Malta.

Hydro Plant: Clarence Swett reported that the Bicentennial Committee has decided on a site for the hydro plant. It will be placed at the far end of the city park. No one has been found yet who will move both the building and the hydro plant. The committee is looking into prices for a new brick building.

Rates, Rules, and Regulations: Our new irrigation rate has been approved effective August 1, 1976. We are now 100% membership. Robert Vaughan explained what we need to do to get out from under Public Service rule since we serve only members. He also went over the By-Law changes that will have to be passed. CLARENCE SWETT MOVED THAT WE CHANGE THE BY-LAWS TO AUTOMATICALLY ACCEPT FOR MEMBERSHIP ANYONE WHO APPLIES FOR SERVICE. GENE PENGELLY SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT PASSED UNANIMOUSLY. Robert Vaughan then read a letter that will be mailed to the Public Service Commission concerning their jurisdiction of us. The board approved the mailing of this letter. GENE PENGELLY MOVED TO ACCEPT THE 46 WELLS AND 28 WENDOVER MEMBERSHIPS. CLARENCE SWETT SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Budget: Nothing new to report.

Selection of Manager: 14 applications have been received so far. Applications will be accepted through September 10. The committee feels that there are some real good prospects and noted that a lot of interest has been shown in the job.

Selection of Acting Manager: The key employees selected Vernon Dalton as the acting manager. GENE PENGELLY MOVED THAT VERNON DALTON BE SELECTED AS ACTING MANAGER AND SIGN ALL NECESSARY C.F.C. AND R.E.A. FORMS. BOB WRIGHT SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Donation to Medical Center: GENE PENGELLY MOVED THAT WREC DONATE \$50 EACH MONTH TO THE MEDICAL CENTER TO GO TOWARDS THEIR ELECTRIC BILL. ART GROCK SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Annual Meeting: The board discussed different ways to try and get better attendance at our Annual Meeting. GENE PENGELLY MOVED THAT WE HOLD OUR ANNUAL MEETING ON THE EVENING OF SEPTEMBER 11, 1976, AT THE HIGH SCHOOL WITH A MOVIE FOR THE CHILDREN AT THE THEATER AND A DINNER TO FOLLOW THE MEETING AND MOVIE. CLARENCE SWETT SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT PASSED UNANIMOUSLY. A committee of Gene Pengelly, Jim Ballard, Vernon Dalton, and Clarence Swett was selected to arrange everything for the meeting. BOB WRIGHT MOVED THAT WE HAVE RURALITE SERVICES MAKE A FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE MEMBERS TO RECEIVE AT THE ANNUAL MEETING. ART GROCK SECONDED THE MOTION AND THE MOTION PASSED. Vernon Dalton and Jim Ballard will select what should go into the financial report.

Region IX Meeting: This meeting will be held October 4, 5, & 6 at the Sheraton Harbor Island in San Diego, California. John Krenka, Jim Ballard, Bob Wright, Gene Pengelly, and Vernon Dalton will attend the meeting. Bob Wright was selected as the official voting delegate and John Krenka as the alternate.

Report from Nominating Committee: Mike Jensen, Chairman of the committee reported that there were 11 people nominated to run for the three vacancies on the Board. The 11 people nominated are: Jim Ballard, Ferris Brough, Iris Dahl, George Harris, W.A. "Win" Lindquist, Gene Pengelly, Joe Swabb, Clarence Swett, Kenneth Taylor, Antje Weeks, and Frank Winchell. BOB WRIGHT MOVED THAT THE REPORT OF THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE BE APPROVED. GENE PENGELLY SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Selection of Election Committee: The board selected Deby Johns, Geraldine DiGrazia, and Anita Cory as the Election Committee with Betty Smiley and Dell Thorne as alternates. GENE PENGELLY MOVED THAT THESE PEOPLE BE SELECTED AS THE ELECTION COMMITTEE. CLARENCE SWETT SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT PASSED UNANIMOUSLY. (Exhibit II)

Tent Mountain: Art Grock asked what the schedule was for removal of the Tent Mountain line. Don Snyder stated that it would be removed as soon as there are no more new consumers who need hook-ups, which will probably be this winter.

Analysis of By-Laws: Bob Vaughan passed out copies of amended By-Laws with suggested R.E.A. By-Laws. These copies stated what our present By-Laws are, what the R.E.A. form says, and his recommendation. The board decided to discuss these By-Laws at the next meeting.

Civil Rights Compliance Review: Mr. Jack Stevens from R.E.A. in Washington was present at the meeting to explain his findings from his review of the past week and his recommendations to the utility.

Pending R.E.A. Loan: Mr. Clarence Lee of Lee Engineering was present at the meeting to present our two-year work plan for 1977-78. He explained what had to be done in the next two years and the cost for doing this work. BOB WRIGHT MOVED THAT WE ASK FOR A LOAN OF \$1,416,400. GENE PENGELLY SECONDED THE MOTION AND THE MOTION PASSED.

WPPS 4 & 5: Don Snyder stated that he received a form from them stating that we can sign the output of WPPS 4 & 5 over to other people if the utility does not need it. He gave the agreement to Bob Vaughan and asked him to look over it before we sign it.

WPPS Participants Committee Designation: A meeting was held August 12 in Richland asking WPPS participants to designate someone as their representative on the WPPS committee. GENE PENGELY MOVED THAT VERNON DALTON BE NAMED THE OFFICIAL VOTING DELEGATE TO THIS MEETING. THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY CLARENCE SWETT AND PASSED UNANIMOUSLY. The Board decided on Pacific Northwest Generating Committee as our representative.

Wendover Pump Bill: Richard Loveland and Don Snyder attended a Wendover town meeting and offered Wendover the same agreement as a line extension agreement. They will guarantee us \$8,600/year for eight years.

The meeting was adjourned 4:00 p.m.

The next matter to come before the meeting concerned the proposed amendment to the By-laws of the corporation, the effect of which would be to admit to membership, automatically, all persons, partnerships, firms, associations, corporations, body politics and subdivisions thereof which persons or entities are consumers purchasing power from the cooperative. The advantages and disadvantages of the proposed By-law changes were discussed, including the matter of voting rights of members and also including the fact that Cooperatives serving members only, by Nevada law, are not subject to the jurisdiction of the Public Service Commission of Nevada, inso far as its rates and security transactions are concerned. After a further discussion of the matter and on motion duly made by Director Swett, seconded by Director O'Connell, the following resolution was passed and adopted by vote of 9 in favor and 0 against:

RESOLVED: That Article VI of the By-laws of the Corporation be deleted in its entirety and that in lieu thereof the following provisions are adopted:

"Article VI. MEMBERSHIPS. 1. Membership. Any person, partnership, firm association, corporation or body politic or subdivision thereof which person or entity has applied to this corporation or to the predecessor power company of this corporation for electric service to be served by the corporation or its predecessor power company shall be, during all times that said person or entity is being served by the corporation, a member thereof. The purpose of this section is to assure that all persons or entities being served by this corporation are members with full voting rights and privileges.

Section 2. Membership Certificates. Membership in the Corporation shall be evidenced by a membership certificate which shall be in such form and shall contain such provisions as shall be determined by the Board of Directors. Such certificate shall be signed by the President and the Secretary of the Corporation and the corporate seal shall be affixed thereto. In case a certificate is lost, destroyed or mutilated a new certificate may be issued therefor

upon such uniform terms as the Board of Directors may prescribe.

In lieu of manually signing membership applications and membership certificates, a facsimile signature of the President and Secretary may be used and may be stamped or printed upon said applications and certificates and the seal of the corporation may be stamped or printed thereon.

Section 3. Membership Name. Memberships shall be issued only in the name of the consumer as stated on the application for electric service. With regard to memberships held in the name of a married person, the following rules shall apply:

(a) The presence at a meeting of either the member or the spouse of the member shall constitute a joint waiver of notice of the meeting;

(b) The vote of either the member or the spouse of the member shall constitute one vote, and the spouse of the member shall have the right to vote only in the absence of the member;

(c) A waiver of notice signed by either the member or the spouse of the member shall constitute a waiver by the member;

(d) Notice to either the member or the spouse of the member shall constitute notice to the member;

(e) Termination of any membership shall terminate the interest of the spouse of the member;

(f) Either the member or the spouse of the member may be elected or appointed as an officer or director, provided that the person appointed or directed meets the qualifications for such office; and

(g) The presence at a meeting of either the member or the spouse of the member shall constitute the presence of a member for purposes of establishing the presence of a quorum.

Section 4. Conversion of Membership Upon Death. Upon the death of a member, the membership may, upon application to the Board of Directors, be transferred to the surviving spouse. The outstanding membership certificate shall be surrendered, and shall be reissued in such manner as shall indicate the change of membership status. The transfer of such membership shall not release the estate of the deceased from any debts due the corporation.

Section 5. Membership and Service Connection Fees. There shall be no membership fee and service connection fees shall be as provided in the rates, rules and regulations of the corporation.

Section 6. Purchase of Electric Energy. Each member shall, as soon as electric energy shall be available, purchase from the corporation all electric energy used on the premises specified in his application for service and shall pay therefor monthly rates which shall from time to time be fixed by the Board of Directors; provided, however, that the Board of Directors may limit the amount of electric energy which the Corporation shall be required to furnish to any one member. It is expressly understood that amounts paid for electric energy in excess of the cost of service are furnished by members as capital and each member shall be credited with the capital so furnished as provided in these bylaws. Each member shall pay to the corporation such minimum amount per month regardless of the amount of electric energy consumed, as shall be fixed by the Board of Directors from time to time. Each member shall also pay all amounts owed by him to the corporation as and when the same shall become due and payable.

Section 7. Termination of Membership. (a) The membership of a member who has ceased, for a period of thirty days, to purchase energy from the corporation shall be automatically cancelled and terminated without further action by the corporation unless service to said member is pursuant to a continuing contractual agreement.

(b) Upon death of a member without leaving a surviving spouse, or cessation of existence of a member, the membership of such member shall thereupon terminate. Termination of membership in any manner shall not release a member or his estate from any debts due the Corporation.

Gentlemen:

The purpose of this letter is to advise the Commission that pursuant to NRS 704.675, Wells Rural Electric Company is subject to the jurisdiction, control and regulation of the Commission only for the purposes of NRS 704.033 to 704.039, inclusive, 704.180, 704.330, 704.350 to 704.410, inclusive, and 704.430 but is not subject to any other jurisdiction, control or regulation of the Commission.

The basis of this position taken is that Wells Rural Electric Company is a non-profit corporation and supplies electric services for the use of its own members only.

Wells Rural Electric Company does not have any customers, consumers or patrons who have not applied for and been granted membership in the Cooperative. All customers, consumers and patrons, as members have full voting rights and privileges.

That all future customers, consumers or patrons will be members of the Cooperative is adequately assured by the presently existing By-Law provisions, the pertinent part of which is in Article VI, Section 1 and stated as follows:

"1. Membership Eligibility. Any person, partnership, firm, association, corporation or body politic or subdivision thereof which person or entity has applied to this corporation for electric service to be served by the corporation or its predecessor power company shall be, during all times that said person or entity is being served by the corporation, a member thereof. The purpose of this section is to assure that all persons or entities being served by this corporation are members with full voting rights and privileges."




