

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS  
OF  
WELLS RURAL ELECTRIC COMPANY

May 18, 1979

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of Wells Rural Electric Company was called to order at 9:05 a.m. on May 18, 1979 in the board room. President Vernon Dalton presided over the meeting.

Directors present were: Gene Pengelly, Jesse Larsen, Ferris Brough, Vernon Dalton, Daryl Eriksen, Bill Wright, Ray Crawford and Clarence Swett. Ester Quilici and John Krenka were unable to attend. Present from the staff were Dan Bryan and Patti Blackett.

Corrections to the minutes: JESSE LARSEN MOVED WE APPROVE THE MINUTES AS WRITTEN. GENE PENGELLY SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Additions to the agenda: Clarification of policy and safety awards.

Manager's Report: Carlin was energized on Monday, May 14, 1979 at 4:19 p.m. The signing of the documents was held Tuesday, May 15th at 10:00 a.m. Lew Eklund will sell us the additional 180 feet for our sub-station for \$500. The attorney's are drawing up the papers on this. JESSE LARSEN MOVED WE APPROVE GENE PENGELLY AS ACTING SECRETARY IN THE EVENT ESTER QUILICI IS UNABLE TO BE PRESENT TO SIGN DOCUMENTS. DARYL ERIKSEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. A city license was purchased for \$200. This will remain in effect until December 31. An open house has been scheduled for June 14, 1979 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

We purchased some gasoline from the 4-Way at 71.3¢ per gallon. We are going to get 4,500 gallons. The last time gasoline was purchased, it cost 56.6¢ per gallon.

We received a letter from Attorney Robert Vaughan that the cost of his fees is going up 15.23¢. The last increase was in 1977. GENE PENGELLY MOVED WE ACCEPT THE NEW INCREASE. BILL WRIGHT SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Lee Standley will be joining us on June 11th as Operations Superintendent. He has had 28 years experience with Union Electric in St. Louis. In the capital budget, we have allocated money for two couriers. Since Wendover received another truck, we could take the money budgeted for one of the couriers and increase it so we could buy a vehicle for Mr. Standley. He has indicated he would prefer a bronco type vehicle. GENE PENGELLY MOVED WE INCREASE THE CAPITAL BUDGET BY \$2,500 FOR A NEW VEHICLE. DARYL ERIKSEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

We purchased a new line truck which will be used in Wendover.

We received 3 bids for exterior work on the building. One bid was from John Wiggins of Wells for \$750. The next lowest cost was \$1,130.00 from Glen Sampley from Elko and he also submitted another bid of \$1,800.00. The lowest bid was selected.

We will be advertising in the paper three vehicles that are of no use to us. They are a 1971 4 x 4 line truck, a 1968 GMC van and a 1965 1/2 ton GMC.

We received a letter from Bob Vaughan regarding Vernon Westwood. Vernon said he would pay the bill in full before June 1st and if it is not paid, he would give us security for the payment of the sums due the Company on his horses which have an estimated value of \$70,000. It was stated that we should go by the policy. GENE PENGELLY MOVED WE SEND A LETTER TO BOB VAUGHAN STATING THAT IF PAYMENT IS NOT RECEIVED BY JUNE 1, 1979, WE WILL PROCEED IN TAKING A LIEN ON HIS HORSES. DARYL ERIKSEN SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

CFC Resolutions: On motion duly made by Gene Pengelly and seconded by Jesse Larsen it was unanimously decided that:

WHEREAS, the Cooperative desires to have National Rural Utilities Cooperative Finance Corporation (CFC) act as its paying agent in certain transactions in which the Cooperative is obligated to make payments to others; and

Whereas, the Cooperative, in providing the funds with which CFC may make such payments on the Cooperative's behalf, desires to use its line of credit established with CFC;

NOW, THEREFORE, the following resolutions are hereby adopted:

WHEREAS, the Cooperative desires to have National Rural Utilities Cooperative Finance Corporation (CFC) act as its paying agent in certain transactions in which the Cooperative is obligated to make payments to others; and

WHEREAS, the Cooperative, in providing funds with which CFC may make such payments on the Cooperative's behalf, desires to use those funds due the Cooperative from time to time on account of the maturity of the Cooperative's investment in CFC commercial paper.

NOW, THEREFORE, the following resolutions are hereby adopted:

RESOLVED: that Danny R. Bryan, General Manager and Patricia A. Nolz, Office Manager, are each individually authorized hereby to direct CFC to make payments on behalf of the Cooperative to the following organization:

Rural Electrification Administration (REA), such payments to be made by bank wire transfer to the Department of Treasury account of REA at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York (in accordance with REA Bulletin 20-9, Exhibit K; for this purpose the Cooperative's REA Reference Number is 29-015).

RESOLVED, that CFC is hereby authorized and directed to make such payments by one of the individuals named above;

RESOLVED; that CFC is hereby authorized and directed to use, from time to time, the proceeds of maturing CFC commercial paper purchased by the Cooperative, in order to make said payments;

RESOLVED, that these resolutions shall remain in full force and effect until CFC is otherwise notified in writing by the Cooperative.

In our policy, the reconnect charges are up to \$10 and up to \$25 for after hours. This amount will never cover the costs for disconnecting a meter in the rural areas. We may have to consider changing this.

We are doing some ground work on developing a cash flow program. We are paying bills on the 8th and 9th of each month and the last working day of the month.

Annual Meeting Committee: The actual costs of the meeting have not been determined. Without the distribution of labor, costs came to \$2,021.52. Total cost for the dinner was \$707.00.

Area Development Committee: There was a meeting on May 9th with Chromalloy. Chromalloy turned down the 24 month time frame. They wanted us to approve a 5 or 7 year plan to pay. Rich Loveland came into the meeting to discuss the figures on the memo that was sent out to the directors. The committee recommends that we change the 24 months to 60 or 84 months. This contract will be based on actual costs and not Clarence Lee's estimate. FERRIS BROUGH MOVED WE CHANGE THE 24 MONTHS TO 60 OR 84 MONTHS. BILL WRIGHT SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. We have not heard anything from Andy Anderson.

Scholarship Committee: Ray, Bill, Gene and Dan went to Wendover on May 14th to conduct interviews. There were 4 applicants from Wendover, 3 from Wells and 2 from Elko. Paul Howell was selected as the recipient of the scholarship and Lucy Tomera as the alternate. Four of the applicants disqualified themselves because they planned on attending 4 year schools. Because of Carlin coming on the line, GENE PENGELLY MOVED WE AMEND POLICY 9-1, PART 3, QUALIFICATIONS, CHANGE 2 YEARS TO 6 MONTHS. CLARENCE SWETT SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Appliance & Safety Report: The safety meeting was held in the service center on May 1, 1979 with Vic Olsen from Ruralite conducting the meeting. We discussed an accident that happened in another Co-op. Due to inatentiveness and disregard on the part of some employees, a serious accident occured where the employee lost his arm. Most of the meeting was devoted to capacitors, how to use them, their function and the hazard encountered in their use. Also, with the use of test equipment, Mr. Olsen put on a very interesting and informative class. No accidents or near misses were reported during the past month.

Appliance sales have been a little slower within the past month. I have been out of the office most of the month. I have been spending most of the time in Carlin. We have had a number of consumers showing interest and buying appliances in Wendover. We have sold two washers and one dryer for the month.

Construction Report: Construction for the month of April consisted of routine replacing of services, secondaries and secondary poles. A two pole 1Ø tap to Tom Watkins at Wendover was completed. The underground primary and secondaries have been installed to the G & T apts. and KOA Campgrounds in west Wendover. The wiring, heating and lighting at the Carlin office is now complete and the two new services to the building has been completed. The line crew has added a VG210 unit, ground secondary and pole to Jack Gardner's irrigation pump at Ruby Valley. The substation at Carlin in nearing completion. The line crew has been working 11 hours a day on the Carlin project as we are shooting for May 10th to energize Carlin. We have the contractor working on some irrigation pump installations.

Regional Power Planning: Nothing new.

Hydro Plant: Nothing new.

Engineering Report: The contractor has all the poles set on the Carlin line and should have the wire up by the 10th of May. We are working on the apartment - KOA project by G & T Construction in Wendover. Work is progressing on several irrigation projects and we have new applications from F. Egbert and V. Dalton. We have some preliminary work done on an underground proposal from V.W. Birdzell. We received a petition for service from several residents and landowners in Meadow Valley Ranches. The unit is along the North Fork but is south of our service area. We initiated 15 construction and 9 retirement work orders during the month of April. Lloyd Hildestad began work April 30th at the warehouse position. We have provided additional information to the local office of Chromalloy so they can submit it to their home office for approval of the engineering fee.

Community Development Committee: Daryl Eriksen held two meetings. This committee talked the city into hiring a City Manager. The Mayor wants to hire a City Manager before the election. They have received two applications and will interview them Tuesday at the City Council Meeting.

Employee & Director Institutes & Schools: Patty Comstock will be here June 19th and 20th to present course 951, "Human Behavior and Communication." Dan mentioned the Summer Schools of the West offered by N.R.E.C.A. Some required courses are offered in Snowmass, Colorado. The annual Manager's Conference is in August and Dan would like to attend if the agenda looks worthwhile.

Power Source: Vernon visited with various firms in Washington about wind energy. CH2M Hill looks like they may be the best firm to submit our proposal. Dan will visit with them on this.

Claim by Mr. & Mrs. Ned Smiley: The attorney has advised us that our responsibility ends at the meter. We have turned the claim into our insurers. They will take what action they feel the claim requires. The Smiley's were notified this was done.

<sup>5/10</sup> New Memberships: CLARENCE SWETT MOVED WE APPROVE THE 6 MEMBERSHIPS FROM WELLS, THE 18 MEMBERSHIPS FROM WENDOVER AND THE 522 MEMBERSHIPS FROM CARLIN. GENE PENGELLY SECONDED THE MOTION AND IT CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Clarification of Policy: Gene would like to know if the meeting lasts all day, under the policy, is the director to pay for his own lunch or is the Company to pay for it. It was stated that each director should pay for his own meal. The Policy was read and it was decided that the policy states that for less than 12 hours, directors, employees and Manager will be reimbursed actual expenses. The Company will pay for the meal.


